M.R.030388 - In re: Charles Paul Horn. Disciplinary Commission.

Motion by respondent, Charles Paul Horn for a hearing on the Administrator's petition for reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763. Denied.

Petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763. Allowed. Respondent Charles Paul Horn, who has been disciplined in the State of Florida, is disbarred in the State of Illinois.

Order entered by the Court.

M.R.030470 - In re: Joel Alan Brodsky. Disciplinary Commission.

Motion by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to approve and confirm the report and recommendation of the Hearing Board. Allowed. Respondent Joel Alan Brodsky is suspended from the practice of law for two (2) years and until further order of the Court, retroactive to June 19, 2019.

Order entered by the Court.

M.R.030480 - In re: Katherine Anne Dierdorf. Disciplinary Commission.

Petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763. Allowed. Respondent Katherine Anne Dierdorf, who has been disciplined in the State of Missouri, is suspended from the practice of law in the State of Illinois for three (3) years and until she is reinstated to the practice of law in the State of Missouri.

Suspension effective December 4, 2020.

Respondent Katherine Anne Dierdorf shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from her conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension.

M.R.030486 - In re: Chandra Lin Justice. Disciplinary Commission.

Petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission for leave to file exceptions to the report and recommendation of the Review Board. Denied. Respondent Chandra Lin Justice is censured and required to successfully complete either the ARDC Professionalism Seminar or the Proactive Management-Based Regulation (PMBR) Self-Assessment Program within one (1) of the Court's order imposing discipline, as recommended by the Review Board.

M.R.030491 - In re: Raymond Gupta. Disciplinary Commission.

Petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763. Allowed. Respondent Raymond Gupta, who has been disciplined in the State of Indiana, is suspended from the practice of law in the State of Illinois for three (3) years and until further order of the Court.

Order entered by the Court.

M.R.030495 - In re: Patrick J. O'Shea. Disciplinary Commission.

Petition by Patrick J. O'Shea to be placed on permanent retirement status pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 756(a)(8). Denied. Effective immediately.

Motion by respondent Patrick J. O'Shea to compel the Administrator to consent to petition for permanent retirement status. Denied.

M.R.030499 - In re: Matthew James Stropes. Disciplinary Commission.

Petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose discipline on consent pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 762(b). Allowed. Respondent Matthew James Stropes is suspended from the practice of law for two (2) years and until further order of the Court.

Order entered by the Court.

Petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose discipline on consent pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 762(b). Allowed. Respondent Peter E. Naylor is suspended from the practice of law for two (2) years and until further order of the Court, with the suspension stayed after one (1) year by a three (3) year period of probation subject to the following conditions, with conditions (a) through (i) to commence upon the effective date of the Court's order:

- a. Respondent shall abstain from the usage of alcohol and any unprescribed controlled substances;
- b. Respondent shall comply with any and all treatment and continuing care recommendations of Dr. Fareed Tabatabai or other treatment provider approved by the Administrator, including the taking of medications as prescribed;
- c. Respondent shall provide the Administrator and Dr. Tabatabai or other approved treatment provider and treatment program(s) with an appropriate release, authorizing the treating professionals to: (1) disclose to the Administrator, on at least a quarterly basis, information pertaining to the nature of respondent's compliance with any treatment plan established with respect to respondent's condition; (2) to promptly report to the Administrator respondent's failure to comply with any part of an established treatment plan; and (3) to respond to any inquiries by the Administrator regarding respondent's treatment and compliance with any established treatment plan;
- d. Respondent shall, as required by the Administrator, submit to random substance testing by a qualified mental health professional or facility approved by the Administrator, within eight (8) hours of receiving notice by the Administrator that he shall submit to the testing or with daily breath testing with an Administrator approved testing device. The results of the tests shall be reported to the Administrator. Respondent shall pay any and all costs of such testing;
- e. Respondent shall attend meetings as scheduled by the Commission probation officer. Respondent shall submit quarterly written reports to the Commission probation officer concerning the status of his practice of law and the nature and extent of his compliance with the conditions of probation;

- f. Respondent shall participate in Alcoholics Anonymous, LAP and/or other 12-step traditions program by attending at least four (4) meetings a week. Respondent is to maintain a log of his attendance at the meetings and submit them to the Administrator with his quarterly reports;
- g. Respondent shall maintain a sponsor in the Alcoholics Anonymous or other 12-step program and shall provide the name, address and telephone number of the sponsor to the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of being placed on probation. Respondent shall request that the sponsor communicate with the Administrator in writing on a quarterly basis regarding respondent's participation and progress in the 12-step program and report any lapses in sobriety or usage of unprescribed controlled substances to the Administrator within seventy-two (72) hours of his/her knowledge of that usage;
- h. Respondent shall report to the Administrator any lapse in his sobriety or usage of any unprescribed controlled substances within seventy-two (72) hours of that usage;
- i. Respondent shall comply with the provisions of Article VII of the Illinois Supreme Court Rules on Admission and Discipline of Attorneys and the Illinois Rules of Professional Conduct and shall timely cooperate with the Administrator in providing information regarding any investigations relating to his conduct;
- j. Respondent shall reimburse the Commission for the costs of this proceeding as defined in Supreme Court Rule 773 and shall reimburse the Commission for any further costs incurred during the period of probation;
- k. At least thirty (30) days prior to the termination of the period of probation, respondent shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from his conduct;
- l. Respondent shall notify the Administrator within seven (7) days of any arrest or charge alleging his violation of any criminal or quasi-criminal statute or ordinance;

- m. Respondent shall notify the Administrator within fourteen (14) days of any change of address; and
- n. Probation shall be revoked if respondent is found to have violated any of the terms of probation. The remaining portion of the two (2) year period of suspension shall commence from the date of the determination that any term of probation has been violated and shall continue until further order of the Court.

Suspension effective December 4, 2020.

M.R.030505 - In re: Lisa Ann Collins. Disciplinary Commission.

Petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763. Allowed. Respondent Lisa Ann Collins, who has been disciplined in the State of Tennessee, is censured in the State of Illinois.

M.R.030516 - In re: Adam Samuel Tracy. Disciplinary Commission.

Motion by Adam Samuel Tracy to strike his name from the roll of attorneys licensed to practice law in Illinois pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 762(a). Allowed. Effective immediately.

M.R.030522 - In re: Michael Constantine Skouteris. Disciplinary Commission.

Motion by Michael Constantine Skouteris to strike his name from the roll of attorneys licensed to practice law in Illinois pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 762(a). Allowed. Effective immediately.

M.R.030524 - In re: Robin Williamson Remley. Disciplinary Commission.

Petition by the Administrator of the Attorney Registration and Disciplinary Commission to impose reciprocal discipline pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 763. Allowed. Respondent Robin Williamson Remley, who has been disciplined in the State of Indiana, is suspended from the practice of law in the State of Illinois for ninety (90) days, with the suspension stayed in its entirety by an eighteen (18) month period of probation subject to the conditions imposed upon respondent by the Supreme Court of Indiana, and until she successfully completes the conditions imposed upon respondent in Indiana and her probation in Indiana is terminated.

Respondent Robin Williamson Remley shall reimburse the Client Protection Program Trust Fund for any Client Protection payments arising from her conduct prior to the termination of the period of suspension/probation.
